Executive Summary

Entering 2025, Knowing God Missions set out a bold agenda: host its first-ever leaders' conference and crusade in Tanzania — a significant expansion beyond our established work in Rwanda; develop small booklets on foundational Christian beliefs for distribution in Rwandan discipleship groups as a pilot; sustain the WhatsApp-based teaching model as a vital discipleship tool; extend outreach into new countries with the support of translators; and review and expand the scholarship program beyond Rwanda to invest in the next generation of Christian leaders.

This report records what became of that vision. The Tanzania mission moved from plan to reality in October, equipping 150 pastors and strengthening ten churches in the Mwanza and Geita regions. The booklet pilot was delivered ahead of schedule: Pastor Fidele's book, *INKINGI Z'ITORERO RYA YESU KRISTO* ("The Pillars of the Church of Jesus Christ"), reached twenty discipleship groups in Rwanda in its first print run, and a second run followed in March. The online teaching model matured into a five-instructor platform carrying daily sessions across East Africa, and preparation was completed to extend teaching into French for Congo. Scholarships continued while groundwork was laid to expand the program regionally in 2026.

2025 was a defining year for Knowing God Missions (KGM). Across Rwanda, Tanzania, Burundi, Uganda, and Congo, what had been a small network of house groups matured into a coordinated regional movement — anchored by daily online teaching, strengthened leadership, a breakthrough mission trip in Tanzania, and the launch of ongoing Classes of Service that are still gathering learners week by week. Three threads ran through the year: the ministry moved from activity to infrastructure, measuring itself by leaders, translators, and discipleship classes rather than events; compassion walked alongside the Gospel, with health insurance, livestock, disaster relief, and first-aid training delivered to the most vulnerable; and the power of God remained the engine of the work, confirmed in both the ordinary rhythms of weekly teaching and in the deliverances and healing we witnessed in Tanzania.

Ministry Activities & Growth

Ongoing coordination formed the quiet backbone of the year. Each month, platform leaders in every country received follow-up on their planned activities, mentorship, and alignment with the vision of the five pillars. In February, four productive leadership meetings — two with Rwandan group leaders and two with the Burundi ministry committee — set the strategic direction for the year, prioritizing translator training, short English courses for volunteers, and deeper local implementation of the five pillars. March and April deepened that work, culminating in final preparations for the Tanzania mission.

Publishing & Teaching Resources

February marked the publication of Pastor Fidele’s book, *INKINGI Z’ITORERO RYA YESU KRISTO* (“The Pillars of the Church of Jesus Christ”). An initial print run of one hundred copies was produced and distributed across twenty discipleship groups in Rwanda. In March, a second print run of fifty additional copies was completed. A Holy Spirit teachings exam was also prepared and translated into Kinyarwanda, administered across groups, and followed by support sessions for participants who faced difficulties.

Online Teaching Platforms

Five Canada-based instructors carried the daily load of online teaching across East Africa, delivered primarily through WhatsApp — a low-bandwidth, accessible channel that reached leaders in areas with limited digital infrastructure. John (Uganda) bridged biblical wisdom with scientific insight; Nick (Rwanda) taught the transformative power of the Holy Spirit and prepared to extend his teaching into French for the Congo platform; Lyne (Kenya–Tanzania) led discipleship and Christian-living sessions emphasizing perseverance; Pastor Andy addressed false doctrines widespread across the region; and Pastor Fidele supported every platform through materials, prayer, and bi-weekly sessions with local leaders. Activity was highest in Rwanda, moderate in Tanzania and Burundi, and emerging in Uganda — with Kenya and Congo identified as priority fields for 2026.

Mutual Support & Humanitarian Response

Love in action remained a defining mark of the network. KGM provided critical support to a member whose home had been destroyed by severe rainfall, addressing immediate reconstruction and humanitarian needs. Ongoing support was given to our main secondary school scholar who is in his third year in secondary school.

Tanzania Mission Trip — October 2025

After two earlier postponements, the Tanzania mission moved forward in October under the theme “God’s Plans Never Fail.” Pastor Fidele Bolton and Dr. Zed arrived at Mwanza International Airport from Canada and were received by the East Africa Director and local KGM coordinators. The team based itself first in Musoma on Lake Victoria, where a one-day Leaders’ Conference introduced the Five Pillars, then extended into Msanja for community fellowship. The mission’s most intensive phase followed in Masumbwe, in the Geita region, where mornings were given to in-depth theological and practical training for local pastors and afternoons to open-air evangelistic crusades. Eight churches were visited and strengthened during this phase.



Alongside preaching and teaching, the team lived out the pillar of compassion in tangible ways. Ten comprehensive health-insurance packages brought seventy people under professional medical protection. Dr. Zed hosted First Aid and Emergency Response training sessions to build life-saving skills in rural communities. Forty goats were distributed to forty of the most vulnerable families — widows, orphans, and households in extreme need — identified in partnership with local church leaders.



The mission also saw the Kingdom move in power. In both Msanja and Geita, spiritual manifestations gave way to deliverance and great calm under authoritative prayer. In Masumbwe, a young boy who had been paralyzed and unable to walk for three months stood up and walked before the community after prayer — a sign and wonder that confirmed the preached word.

Classes of Service — The Legacy Continues

The Tanzania mission did not end when the team departed. In October, KGM launched Classes of Service — weekly discipleship classes designed to equip believers with a deep understanding of the Word and a heart for service. By year-end, four active classes were gathering seventy-eight committed learners across Masumbwe and Musoma. Hunger for the Word was strong, and the classes quickly became the most important fruit of the mission.

2025 Financial Summary

Total donations reached \$25,307 CAD, while operating expenses totaled \$21,028 CAD — producing a net surplus of \$4,279 CAD that strengthens KGM’s financial position for 2026 ministry expansion.

Looking Ahead to 2026

In the second half of 2025, the landscape of KGM's ministry in Rwanda shifted dramatically: ninety percent of our KGM-affiliated churches in the country were closed. What began as heavy news has, through prayer and pastoral discernment, become a clear call to a different and more profound way of doing church — a return to the first-century Acts model of household groups. Entering 2026, KGM is focusing its Rwanda effort entirely on “house groups.” Our faith commitment is to plant one new house group every month. This is not a retreat. It is a restoration. Where a building-based model proved fragile, a household-based model roots the Gospel more deeply into the fabric of everyday life, reaches people who would never walk into a church, and moves discipleship from events to relationships.

Priorities for 2026

To sustain the pivot and carry the ministry forward, KGM is focusing its 2026 fundraising on six interconnected priorities:

- **National Pastor/Planter Support.** Funding a full-time salary for the dedicated woman who will oversee the nationwide network of Rwanda house groups. This is the single most strategic investment of the year.
- **East Africa School of Service.** Continuing the training program in Tanzania launched in October 2025, with prayer and preparation to extend the School of Service into Uganda, Burundi, Congo, and Kenya
- **The Grace Scholarship Program.** Expanding current educational support in Rwanda while actively investigating new opportunities to support students in Tanzania.
- **Compassionate Care.** Providing food assistance to poor households and supporting hospitalized patients who lack the means to cover their medical expenses — meeting urgent, practical needs as an expression of the love of Christ.
- **Essential Operations.** Covering administrative costs such as international bank transfer fees and website hosting. KGM makes every effort to keep these costs as low as possible so that gifts flow directly to the ministry.

A Different Kind of Mission Trip This Year

Ordinarily at this point in the year, Pastor Fidele would be raising funds for his annual mission trip. In 2026, KGM is doing things differently. Rather than fund travel expenses for a Canadian-led mission trip, the support that would have gone to airfare and logistics is being redirected to cover the \$6,000 annual salary of the Rwandan National Pastor/Planter. Her on-the-ground leadership — year-round, embedded, Rwandan — will take the place of a visiting mission this year. Every contribution, large or small, goes directly toward planting and sustaining the household groups.
